CATCO is excited to announce the appointment of five apprentices for the 2016-17 season funded in part by the Crane Group and longtime CATCO and CATCO is Kids supporter Kitty Morton Epler. The apprentices are Nick Murphy (sound and light); Janin Rosas (costumes); Matthew Sierra (acting); Ben Tracy (acting); and Abigail Worden (acting).

Murphy, a recent graduate of Wesleyan University with a degree in government and environmental studies, spent four years as a theatre technician at Wesleyan's Center for the Arts, working for both university productions and touring theatre and dance companies. Recent onstage roles include *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* and *Much Ado about Nothing*.

Rosas, a student stitcher in the costume shop and women's dresser for the Porthouse Theatre this summer, recently graduated from the University of Michigan with a theatre arts degree. Her costume designer credits include *Mary Poppins*, *Seussical the Musical* and *Agamemnon*. Her technical theatre credits in wardrobe include *Guys and Dolls*, *American Idiot* and *Julius Caesar in Egypt*.

Sierra has appeared on stage recently at multiple central Ohio theatre organizations. His acting credits Lord Alfred Douglas in CATCO's recent production of *Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde*, *The Kabuki Sleeping Beauty* with CATCO is Kids!, and *POZ* with Evolution Theatre company.

Tracy recently graduated from Wright State University with a bachelor of fine arts degree in acting, where he appeared in *The Great Gatsby* (Nick Carraway) and *The Music Man* (Charlie Cowell), among other shows. A native of Minneapolis, he has worked with CLIMB Theatre and Old Log Theatre. His short play, *One Cow Mooing*, premiered with Theatre Oxford in Mississippi this October.

A recent graduate of Capital University with a degree in theatre studies/communication and a minor in public relations, Warden's theatre credits include: stage management (*The Mystery of Edwin Drood*, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*); properties (*The Addams Family*, *Speed Dating Tonight*); directing (*Cabaret*); and performance (*Metamorphoses*, *A Flea in Her Ear*).

“CATCO and CATCO is Kids are excited to welcome these extremely talented apprentices and look forward to working with them in our productions and in our education and outreach programs,” said Steven C. Anderson, CATCO producing director. CATCO’s apprentice program provides young artists experience in various aspects of the theatre, including acting for CATCO and CATCO is Kids, understudying CATCO productions, and providing educational programming in schools.

During the season, CATCO’s apprentices will take classes and workshops from CATCO staff, ranging from audition master classes to artist education training. They will also tackle understudy assignments in main stage season productions; perform leading roles in touring productions and main-stage productions on the CATCO is Kids stage; and perform leading and supporting roles on the CATCO stage. They will also be asked to perform technical theatre and administrative assignments.
